1. Attendees will describe strategies to implement the Standards for Adult Immunization Practice.
2. Attendees will describe the benefits of utilizing the New York State Immunization Information System (NYSIIS) for your practice and your patients.
3. Attendees will be able to describe recommended vaccinations according to the ACIP adult immunization schedule.
4. Attendees will be able to identify indications, contraindications, and precautions to vaccination.
5. Attendees will be able to describe vaccine hesitancy in adults and strategies to overcome barriers to immunization.
6. Attendees will be able to describe strategies for measles control measures and for enforcement of DOH mandates for immunizations.
7. Attendees will describe at least 1 adult immunization related QPP Quality measure and promoting interoperability measures.
8. Attendees will describe at least 1 strategy for encouraging clinicians to report applicable QPP measures to NYSIIS.
9. Participants will be able to discuss some of the challenges faced by a person living with Hepatitis B
10. Recognize the importance of the Hepatitis B vaccination.
